Match background

Poland's first UEFA Champions League representatives in 20 years, Legia Warszawa kick off their campaign with a Group F home fixture against Borussia Dortmund.

Previous meetings

- This is the clubs' first official encounter though they met in a friendly in Warsaw on 29 July 2012, which Dortmund won 1-0 through a fourth-minute Robert Lewandowski goal.

- The lineups were:

Match background

Legia

- The Polish title holders are participating in the UEFA Champions League group stage for the first time since 1995/96 when they reached the quarter-finals under Paweł Janas. They are the first team from Poland to appear at this stage since RTS Widzew Łódź in 1996/97.

- Legia came through three qualifying rounds to reach this stage, overcoming HŠK Zrinjski (1-1 away, 2-0 home), FK AS Trenčín (1-0 a, 0-0 h) and Dundalk FC (2-0 a, 1-1 h).

- Legia finished bottom of their group in the 2015/16 UEFA Europa League (W1 D1 L4).

- They have never beaten German opposition in eight previous attempts (D3 L5).

- Their most recent encounter with a Bundesliga club brought a UEFA Cup second-round defeat in 2002/03 against FC Schalke 04 (2-3 h, 0-0 a).

- Legia's two heaviest home losses in their European history were against German opponents: a 7-3 drubbing by FC Bayern München in the 1988/89 UEFA Cup first round, and a 4-0 reverse against TSV 1860 München in the 1964/65 European Cup Winners' Cup quarter-finals.

Dortmund

- Dortmund are returning to the UEFA Champions League after a one-season absence. On their last appearance, in 2014/15, they reached the last 16.

- In the UEFA Europa League last season, they reached the quarter-finals before losing 5-4 on aggregate to Liverpool FC. Their away record was W5 D1 L2.

- Dortmund's only previous official meeting with a Polish club came during their triumphant 1996/97 UEFA Champions League campaign when they faced Widzew in the group stage (2-1 h, 2-2 a).

Coach and player links

- Besnik Hasi faced Dortmund in his first European home game as coach of RSC Anderlecht in the 2014/15 UEFA Champions League group stage. Anderlecht lost 3-0 that night – Adrián Ramos scoring twice – but later earned a 1-1 draw at Dortmund.

- Hasi played on loan at 1860 München in 1997/98. The next season, he enjoyed a 6-1 aggregate victory over MSV Duisburg with KRC Genk in the 1998/99 European Cup Winners' Cup second round. Later, in the UEFA Champions League with Anderlecht, he faced Bayern in the 2003/04 group stage (1-1 h, 0-1 a) and Werder Bremen (h 1-2, a 1-5) in the 2004/05 group stage.

- Łukasz Piszczek won the Polish league title with Zagłębie Lubin in 2006/07 thanks to a 2-1 last-day win at Legia. He faced Legia four times overall with Zagłębie (W2 L2).

- Adam Hloušek had spells in Germany with 1. FC Kaiserslautern (2011), 1. FC Nürnberg (2012–14) and VfB Stuttgart (2014–2016). His record against Dortmund is W0 D2 L3.

- Mikhail Aleksandrov spent three years in Dortmund's youth and reserve ranks (2007–2010), making five league appearances for their second team.

- Mario Götze and substitute André Schürrle were in the Germany side held 0-0 by the Poland of Michał Pazdan, substitute Tomasz Jodłowiec and their Dortmund team-mate Piszczek in the UEFA EURO 2016 group stage.

- Götze had scored twice when Germany beat Poland 3-1 in a EURO qualifier in Frankfurt in September 2015.

- Kasper Hämäläinen was in the Finland side beaten 2-0 by Götze and Julian Weigl's Germany in a friendly on 31 August this year.
- Roman Bürki made his Switzerland debut in November 2014 in a 2-2 draw against a Poland side featuring Michał Kucharczyk and substitute Łukasz Broż.

Match facts

Legia

- Legia are five games without a win on home turf in all competitions.
- Nemanja Nikolić has scored nine goals in 14 outings for Legia this season.
- Legia have managed just 18 goals in 16 games in all competitions this season.
- The Warsaw giants have already used 28 different players in the league this season, with only goalkeeper Arkadiusz Malarz featuring in all eight matches.
- Legia picked up only nine points in their opening eight league games this season though they were little better off with 11 at the same stage last term when they went on to win the league.
- The Polish champions lost the Polish Super Cup 4-1 against KKS Lech Poznań on 7 July, their third successive defeat in the fixture.

Dortmund

- Dortmund are unbeaten in 22 Bundesliga home games – two shy of their record set between January 1965 and April 1966 and equalled from November 2001 to March 2003.
- Marco Reus (adductors), Neven Subotić (ribs) and Erik Durm (knee) are long-term injury absentees.
- André Schürrle withdrew from Germany's friendly against Finland and the FIFA World Cup qualifier in Norway due to a back problem but started Saturday's 1-0 loss at RB Leipzig.
- In World Cup qualifying Christian Pulisic scored twice as a substitute for the United States in a 6-0 win against St Vincent and the Grenadines on 2 September.
- Sven Bender and Matthias Ginter won silver medals on Olympic duty for Germany this summer.
- Dortmund started the season with a 2-0 loss to FC Bayern München in the German Super Cup.

Besnik Hasi

Date of birth: 29 December 1971

Nationality: Albanian

Playing career: Liria Prizren, NK Zagreb, FK Dinamo Pančevo (loan), KF Prishtina (loan), NK Samobor (loan), KRC Genk, TSV 1860 München (loan), RSC Anderlecht, KSC Lokeren OV, KSV Cercle Brugge

Coaching career: RSC Anderlecht, Legia Warszawa

- A defensive midfielder, Hasi represented a number of clubs in the former Yugoslavia before gaining his first taste of Belgian football by moving to Genk in 1994.
- After a loan spell at 1860 München in the 1997/98 season, Hasi returned to Genk, winning the Eerste Klasse title in 1999 and the Belgian Cup in 2000, scoring in the final against R. Standard de Liège.
- Made his debut for Albania on 15 November 2000 against Malta and registered the first of his two international goals three years later during a UEFA EURO 2004 qualifier at home to Georgia.
- Linked up with Anderlecht for the first time in 2000 and helped the Brussels club to the championship in 2001 and 2004. After leaving for Lokeren in 2006, he finished his playing career two years later at Cercle Brugge.
- Returned to Anderlecht the same year when he became assistant coach to Ariël Jacobs. In March 2014 he replaced John van den Brom, Jacobs's successor, as head coach and led the club to their 33rd league title, overturning the five-point gap that existed between the Mauves et Blanc and leaders Standard at the beginning of the championship play-offs. Moved to Poland and Legia in June 2016.

Thomas Tuchel

Date of birth: 29 August 1973

Coaching career: VfB Stuttgart (youth coach and U19s assistant coach), FC Augsburg (U19s, academy coordinator and reserves), 1. FSV Mainz 05 (U19s and first-team head coach), Borussia Dortmund

- Tuchel had a fairly undistinguished playing career, retiring prematurely in 1998 due to injury.
- His first off-pitch role was with the Stuttgart youth team. He subsequently joined Augsburg, where he coached the U19s and reserve sides as well as serving as academy coordinator.
- Tuchel moved to Mainz in 2008 and was initially in charge of the U19s, whom he led to a German title. A year after joining the club, Tuchel succeeded Jørn Andersen as coach of the senior team. He went on to qualify twice for the UEFA Europa League, though Mainz were eliminated at the third qualifying round stage on both occasions.
- He took over from Jürgen Klopp in the Dortmund dugout prior to the 2015/16 campaign and led his side to the UEFA Europa League quarter-finals, where they came up against Klopp's Liverpool team – and lost 5-4 on aggregate.
- Dortmund fared well under Tuchel in the Bundesliga in 2015/16, racking up 78 points to finish second behind Bayern München and qualify automatically for the 2016/17 UEFA Champions League group stage. They were also beaten by Bayern in the German Cup final in Tuchel's debut season.
