Match background

Lokomotiv Moskva can no longer reach the UEFA Champions League round of 16 and need a win away to holders Bayern München to have any hope of extending their European season.

- Bayern's long run of wins in the competition was ended at 15 by a draw at Atlético de Madrid on Matchday 5, but Hansi Flick's side had already secured first place in Group A. Lokomotiv, meanwhile, have three points, one behind Salzburg who hold the advantage on head-to-head record having won in Russia last time out; Loko therefore need to win and hope Salzburg fail to do likewise at home to Atlético to leapfrog their Austrian opponents into third place.
- Joshua Kimmich scored Bayern's 79th-minute winner in Moscow on Matchday 2, restoring the visitors' lead nine minutes after Anton Miranchuk had cancelled out Leon Goretzka's first-half opener.

Previous meetings

- The teams' only fixtures before this season came in the first round of Bayern's victorious 1995/96 UEFA Cup campaign, although the German side looked to be up against it when Yevgheni Kharlachev's second-half strike gave Lokomotiv a first-leg victory in Munich.
- Otto Rehhagel's Bayern turned the tie around in spectacular style at the Stadion Lokomotiv in Moscow thanks to a 5-0 victory in which Jürgen Klinsmann scored twice.

Form guide

Bayern

- The German giants extended their competition record run of victories to 15 this season, following up a 4-0 home defeat of Atlético with wins at Lokomotiv and Salzburg (6-2) before a 3-1 home victory against the Austrian side on Matchday 4 sealed progress. Their long winning run was ended by a 1-1 draw at Atleti last time out, the first time Bayern had failed to win a UEFA Champions League match since 13 March 2019. Nevertheless, Thomas Müller's penalty equaliser enabled Bayern to equal another competition record as they registered their 16th successive away game without defeat.
- Bayern claimed their sixth European Cup in 2019/20, and third in the UEFA Champions League era, with a 1-0 final defeat of Paris Saint-Germain in Lisbon. That was Bayern's 11th successive win in the competition, surpassing the record mark they set between April and November 2013 and which Real Madrid matched between April 2014 and February 2015. They were the first unbeaten champions since Manchester United in 2007/08.
- The Munich club became only the seventh team – and first from Germany – to win all six games in the UEFA Champions League group stage last season, hitting 24 goals – one short of Paris's competition record, set in 2017/18.
- The German champions then eased through the knockout stages, beating Chelsea in the round of 16 (3-0 a, 4-1 h) before wins in one-off ties against Barcelona (8-2) – the first time Bayern had scored eight goals in a UEFA Champions League match – Lyon (3-0) and Paris in Lisbon.
- Bayern's 43 goals in last season's UEFA Champions League campaign was the highest total by any club since the competition changed format in 2003/04. The all-time record for a single campaign is the 45 scored by Barcelona in 1999/2000 – though they played 16 matches compared to Bayern's 11 in 2019/20.
- Robert Lewandowski finished as the top scorer in the 2019/20 UEFA Champions League with 15 goals, two shy of Cristiano Ronaldo's competition record of 17 for Real Madrid in 2013/14. The goal he scored against Salzburg on Matchday 4 this season was his 71st in the UEFA Champions League, moving him level with Raúl González in joint third in the competition's all-time scoring list.
- This is Bayern's 24th UEFA Champions League group campaign, fewer only than Barcelona and Real Madrid (both 25). They have now won their section 17 times, including in each of the last three seasons. Only Barcelona have done so more often.
- Champions of Germany for a record 30th time last season – with a landmark eighth successive Bundesliga title – Bayern have reached the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals or better in eight of the last nine seasons, the exception their defeat by eventual champions Liverpool in the 2018/19 round of 16.
- Bayern have already won European silverware this season, defeating UEFA Europa League winners Sevilla 2-1 after extra time in the UEFA Super Cup in Budapest on 24 September thanks to goals from Leon Goretzka (34) and Javi Martínez (104).
- The draw at Atlético on Matchday 5 ended Bayern's run of UEFA competition victories at 16; their sole loss in their last 26 European outings is the 3-1 home defeat by Liverpool in the 2018/19 UEFA Champions League round of 16 second leg (W20 D5).
- Bayern have won all six home UEFA Champions League matches since losing to Liverpool; that is their sole defeat

in their last ten European matches in Munich (W8 D1).

- That 1995 defeat against Lokomotiv is Bayern's sole previous loss to Russian visitors in Munich (W6 D3); they have won their last three home matches without conceding, most recently a 5-0 defeat of Rostov in the 2016/17 UEFA Champions League group stage in which Kimmich scored twice and Lewandowski and Müller once apiece.
- A 3-2 defeat at Rostov in the reverse fixture in 2016/17 is the only one of Bayern's last seven matches against Russian opponents, home and away, that they failed to win.

Lokomotiv

- Loko have drawn three of their five Group A games, the exceptions the home losses to Bayern and, last time out, Salzburg (1-3); they drew 2-2 at Salzburg and home (1-1) and away (0-0) against Atlético.
- Second behind Zenit in the Russian Premier League for the second season running in 2019/20, Lokomotiv are in the group stage for the sixth time overall and the third in successive seasons. Their 2018/19 appearance was their first since 2003/04, which was also their third consecutive group campaign.
- In 2019/20 Loko opened with a 2-1 win at Bayer Leverkusen – their first away victory in the UEFA Champions League since a 2-1 win at Galatasaray in the 2002/03 first group stage; their record between those two victories, qualifying included, was D4 L9 – but lost their next five matches, conceding two goals in each of them. That left them bottom behind Juventus, Atlético and Leverkusen.
- Lokomotiv have finished bottom of their section in each of the last two seasons.
- The Moscow club have lost 13 of their last 18 UEFA Champions League group matches, winning two and none of the last ten (D3 L7), since that victory in Leverkusen last season. Matchday 1 was their first draw in the competition proper since 5 November 2003, when their match at Internazionale ended 1-1; they have now picked up three draws in five matches this season.
- Lokomotiv have also won only two of their last 19 European games, losing 14.
- Last season's victory at Leverkusen and the draws at Salzburg and Atlético in the current campaign are the only times Loko have avoided defeat in their last nine away European matches.
- The 1995 win at Bayern was Lokomotiv's first away game in Germany; they lost each of the next three before winning at Leverkusen last season.
- That victory at Leverkusen is the only one of Loko's last ten games against German clubs, home and away, in which they avoided defeat.

Latest news

Bayern

- The injured Joshua Kimmich's next appearance in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final, will be his 50th. He made his 50th appearance in UEFA club competition on Matchday 3.
- Thomas Müller has played 120 matches in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final; no German has played in the competition more. Manuel Neuer (115) is also now ahead of previous record holder Philipp Lahm's total of 112 matches.

- In 2020 Bayern have prevailed in 38 of their 43 matches. After a 0-0 draw at home to Leipzig on 9 February, they were on a run of 23 successive competitive wins – a new German record – and 32 matches without defeat until a 4-1 loss at Hoffenheim on 27 September.
- Hansi Flick's side have won 12 of their 15 matches since that defeat at Hoffenheim, scoring 47 goals in total. The exceptions were the 1-1 draws at home to Werder Bremen in the Bundesliga on 21 November and at Atlético on Matchday 5, and Saturday's 3-3 draw at home to Leipzig.
- The draw with Leipzig meant Bayern had gone two successive games without a win for the first time since November/December 2019. It is also the first time they have dropped points in consecutive home Bundesliga games since a four-game winless run between September and November 2018.
- A 3-2 win in Dortmund on 7 November was Müller's 358th Bundesliga appearance and his 261st win, surpassing Oliver Kahn's Bayern club record. Müller scored twice against Leipzig at the weekend and now has six league goals this season, just two short of his tally for the whole of 2019/20.
- Robert Lewandowski has 12 goals after ten Bundesliga matchdays.
- The game in Dortmund was Lewandowski's 300th competitive match for Bayern; he has now made 304 appearances and scored 261 goals.
- Lewandowski has scored 248 league goals for Dortmund and Bayern combined, the third highest Bundesliga total of all time, behind former Bayern striker Gerd Müller (365 goals) and Klaus Fischer (268). His goals against Arminia Bielefeld on 17 October mean he has scored against all 18 current Bundesliga sides, including Bayern.
- Leroy Sané scored in Germany's 3-1 UEFA Nations League win against Ukraine on 14 November.
- Benjamin Pavard and Kingsley Coman were on target for France in a 4-2 UEFA Nations League win against Sweden on 18 November; the world champions will take part in next year's Finals.
- Neuer won his 96th cap for Germany against Spain in the UEFA Nations League on 17 November, surpassing Sepp Maier's national record for a goalkeeper. The 6-0 defeat was the first time he had conceded six goals in a game in his professional career.
- Jamal Musiala, who had become Bayern's youngest ever Bundesliga scorer aged 17 years 205 days in an 8-0 win against Schalke on 18 September, scored on his first start for England Under-21s in a 5-0 win against Albania in UEFA European Championship qualifying on 17 November.
- Bouna Sarr returned on Matchday 5 having missed Bayern's previous three games due to a thigh problem.
- Javi Martínez went off midway through the first half against Leipzig at the weekend. Musiala scored within five minutes of replacing him.
- Corentin Tolisso played 83 minutes in the 3-1 win at Stuttgart on 28 November, his first appearance since 7 November due to muscular injury, but has missed the last two games with a similar problem.
- Kimmich suffered a knee injury against Dortmund and is not expected to return until January, although he resumed light training on 30 November.
- Alphonso Davies had to be replaced just three minutes into the 5-0 win against Eintracht Frankfurt on 24 October after suffering an ankle injury and has not played since, although he returned to team training on 3 December.
- Malik Tillman has been sidelined by a knee injury since 2 October.
- Bright Arrey-Mbi and substitute Angelo Stiller both made their UEFA Champions League debuts at Atlético.
- Neuer, David Alaba, Davies, Kimmich, Coman, Leon Goretzka, Müller, Serge Gnabry and Lewandowski, plus former Bayern midfielder Thiago Alcántara, are among the candidates for UEFA.com fans' Men's Team of the Year.

Lokomotiv

- Grzegorz Krychowiak and Fedor Smolov's next appearances in UEFA club competition will be their 50th.
- Marko Nikolić's side have won only two of their last 11 games in all competitions (D4 L5), coming from behind to beat Rubin 3-1 on Saturday with Vladislav Ignatyev scoring twice.
- Loko's other win in that sequence was a 1-0 home defeat of Arsenal Tula on 21 November. Anton Miranchuk got the only goal from the penalty spot, and has now scored six of Loko's last nine goals, including another penalty at the weekend.
- Lokomotiv's six-game unbeaten domestic run was ended by a 2-1 league loss at home to Rotor Volgograd on 24 October. They subsequently lost 2-1 at Sochi and, on 8 November, 5-1 at Dinamo Moskva, the first time they had suffered three successive league defeats since September 2016.

- Having won their first two Russian Premier League matches of 2020/21, Loko then went five matches without a win (D3 L2) but had won four in a row before losing to Rotor.
- Right-back Dmitri Zhivoglyadov received his first Russian senior national team call-up for the internationals in November, although he did not play.
- Daniil Kulikov provided two assists as Russia's U-21 side drew 2-2 in Slovenia in a friendly on 17 November. He had made his debut in 2-0 friendly defeat by Hungary four days earlier.
- Zé Luís broke a bone in his foot against Salzburg and will travel to Rome early next week for an operation that will keep him out until 2021.
- Smolov has undergone shoulder surgery and will return next year.
- Stanislav Magkeev is among the candidates for the award of best young player in the Russian Premier League.
- The 19-year-old midfielder Maksim Mukhin made his debut UEFA Champions League appearance on Matchday 5.
