Match background

Borussia Dortmund hold the upper hand for the second leg of their round of 16 tie against Sevilla, although a late goal has given the Spanish club hope for the return.

- Suso's deflected strike gave the home side an early lead in the first leg, but Mahmoud Dahoud quickly levelled and two goals from Erling Haaland put the visitors in charge before half-time. A late Luuk de Jong goal brought Sevilla back into contention, although to go through they will still need to become only the sixth side in the UEFA Champions League era to overturn a home first-leg loss in the knockout phase.
- Dortmund recovered from an early setback to finish first in Group F, losing at Lazio on Matchday 1 but remaining unbeaten in their next five fixtures (W4 D1) to end the section on 13 points, three ahead of their second-placed Italian rivals.
- UEFA Europa League holders Sevilla reached the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds for the first time since 2017/18 by finishing second behind Chelsea in Group E, also picking up 13 points from their six matches despite a 4-0 loss against the English club at the Estadio Ramón Sánchez-Pizjuán – their heaviest home European defeat.

Previous meetings

- Sevilla and Dortmund's only fixtures before this tie came in the 2010/11 UEFA Europa League group stage. The Spanish side won 1-0 in Germany thanks to a first-half Luca Cigarini goal, before a 2-2 draw in Spain on Matchday 6 with Romaric (31) and Frédéric Kanouté (35) on target for the home side after Shinji Kagawa's fourth-minute opener for Dortmund. Neven Subotić made it 2-2 four minutes after half-time, but Dortmund were unable to find a winning goal.
- That left Sevilla in second place in Group J behind Paris Saint-Germain on ten points, one ahead of eliminated Dortmund.

Form guide

Dortmund

- The German club responded to an opening 3-1 loss at Lazio this season by beating Zenit 2-0 at home before defeating Club Brugge 3-0 both in Belgium and in Germany. A 1-1 draw at home to Lazio on Matchday 5 confirmed their last-16 place before a 2-1 closing win at Zenit clinched top spot in Group F.
- Second in the Bundesliga behind Bayern München for the second season running in 2019/20, this is Dortmund's 15th UEFA Champions League campaign; they were winners in 1997, and runners-up in 2013. BVB have now reached the round of 16 in seven of their last eight participations.
- Under Lucien Favre, who left the club in December 2020 and has been replaced by Edin Terzić until the end of 2020/21, Dortmund were second behind Barcelona in their section last season. They picked up ten points – seven of them at home – to finish ahead of Internazionale and Slavia Praha.
- Dortmund were 2-1 winners at home to Paris Saint-Germain in the round of 16 first leg, but bowed out after going down 2-0 in the return in France. That made their record at this stage W3 L3.
- BVB were beaten away (0-3) and at home (0-1) by Tottenham in the 2018/19 round of 16 and have lost seven of their 13 matches at this stage of the UEFA Champions League (W5 D1).
- Dortmund's home record in the UEFA Champions League round of 16 is W3 L3.
- The German club's win in Seville was only their third in their last 11 knockout phase matches in UEFA competition (D2 L6), both previous victories in that sequence coming at home: 3-2 against Atalanta in the 2017/18 UEFA Europa League round of 32 first leg and last season's first-leg defeat of Paris.
- BVB have won nine of their last 14 European matches (D1 L4), none of the defeats coming at home.
- Haaland, who has found the net in all five of his 2020/21 UEFA Champions League appearances having sat out Matchdays 5 and 6, is the leading scorer in this season's competition with eight goals.
- Despite victories in five of their last six home matches, Dortmund have won only eight of their last 17 European games in their own stadium (D4 L5).
- The German club have lost only three of their 16 home matches against Spanish visitors (W8 D5), and have won five of the last eight (D2 L1).
- The first leg of this tie was only Dortmund's second victory in nine matches against Liga clubs, home and away (D3 L4).
- This is Dortmund's first knockout tie against a Spanish club since a 3-2 aggregate loss to Real Madrid in the 2013/14 UEFA Champions League quarter-finals (0-3 a, 2-0 h). That made their overall record in two-legged ties against Liga

opponents W5 L3. BVB's previous eight games with Liga sides before the first leg of this tie all came in the UEFA Champions League group stage.

- Of the 15 UEFA competition ties in which they won the first leg away, Dortmund have triumphed on aggregate 14 times, most recently against Odd in the 2015/16 UEFA Europa League play-offs (4-3 a, 7-2 h). The sole exception came against Genk in the 2004 UEFA Intertoto Cup third round when a 1-0 away success preceded a 2-1 home defeat and elimination on away goals. They have never before won 3-2 away in the first leg.

Sevilla

- The Spanish side opened Group E with a goalless draw at Chelsea before home wins against Rennes (1-0) and Krasnodar (3-2) and a 2-1 success in Russia that secured progress with two games to spare. That record 4-0 defeat to Chelsea followed before they rounded off the group stage with a 3-1 win at Rennes.

- The Matchday 6 win at Rennes made it six away UEFA Champions League games without defeat for Sevilla (W3 D3), since a 5-1 reverse at Spartak Moskva on Matchday 3 in 2017/18.

- The Andalusian club have won only one of their four away games in the UEFA Champions League round of 16, though that was the most recent, 2-1 at Manchester United in 2017/18 (2-1 agg); their record otherwise is D1 L2.

- This is Sevilla's sixth UEFA Champions League campaign, and a first since 2017/18, when they reached the quarter-finals. They have now qualified for the knockout phase in all but one of their participations.

- Fourth in Spain in 2019/20, Sevilla have been group runners-up in their two most recent seasons in the competition, meaning this is the third successive campaign in which they have reached the round of 16.

- Julen Lopetegui's side won the UEFA Europa League in 2019/20, beating Internazionale 3-2 in the final. It was the club's record-extending sixth triumph in the UEFA Cup/UEFA Europa League, all since 2006.

- Sevilla finished first in their UEFA Europa League group last season with 15 points having won all but one of their matches, then ousted CFR Cluj on away goals in the round of 32 (1-1 a, 0-0 h) before victories in one-off ties in Germany against Roma (2-0), Wolverhampton Wanderers (1-0), Manchester United (2-1) and Inter.

- In September, Sevilla lost 2-1 after extra time to European champions Bayern in the UEFA Super Cup in Budapest. It was their fifth defeat in the match in six appearances.

- The Spanish side's record in two-legged knockout ties against German opposition is W3 L3. Their last UEFA Champions League campaign was ended by a Bundesliga club, Bayern München winning 2-1 in Seville and on aggregate in that 2017/18 quarter-final.

- Sevilla have still lost only six of their 24 games against German opposition (W12 D6) although they have been beaten in four of their last five such fixtures. Aside from those two defeats by Bayern, they went down 4-2 at Borussia Mönchengladbach in the UEFA Champions League group stage in November 2015 – a result that ended a run of five straight wins against Bundesliga opponents, home and away.

- The loss at Mönchengladbach is Sevilla's only defeat in their last four games against German hosts (W2 D1), the most recent of which was a 0-0 draw at Bayern in that 2017/18 UEFA Champions League quarter-final second leg. They have a strong overall record in Germany with five wins from ten visits to German clubs (D2 L3) plus those four wins in the country that concluded last season's UEFA Europa League triumph.

- Despite defeats by Chelsea and Dortmund in their last two home games, Sevilla have still lost only seven of their last 37 European matches (W25 D5).

- In 2017/18 Sevilla recorded their first round of 16 success at the fourth attempt, ousting Manchester United (0-0 h, 2-1 a). They lost to Fenerbahçe in 2007/08, their first UEFA Champions League campaign, CSKA Moskva in 2009/10 and Leicester City in 2016/17.

- Sevilla have lost the home first leg three times previously in UEFA competition, winning one of those ties on aggregate and losing the other two, even though they were unbeaten in all three second legs. They were eliminated by Porto in the 2010/11 UEFA Europa League round of 32, losing 2-1 at home and going out despite a 1-0 away win; three years later, in the last 16 of the same competition, they beat city rivals Real Betis 4-3 on penalties after each side had won 2-0 away, before their most recent UEFA Champions League campaign was ended by Bayern in 2017/18.

• UEFA Champions League squad changes

- Julian Brandt's next appearance in UEFA club competition will be his 50th.
- Dortmund won their first three matches without conceding since the first leg against Sevilla before going down 4-2 at Bayern on Saturday, a game in which they had led 2-0.
- On 20 February Dortmund prevailed 4-0 at Schalke, Erling Haaland scoring twice.
- One week later BVB won 3-0 against Arminia Bielefeld, Reinier scoring his first goal for the club.
- Haaland struck twice in the first nine minutes against Bayern at the weekend; Dortmund were the first visiting team to score two Bundesliga goals in the first nine minutes at Bayern since Duisburg in 1977.
- Dortmund reached the semi-finals of the German Cup on 2 March thanks to a 1-0 win at Mönchengladbach. Jadon Sancho scored the only goal, with Dortmund holding on despite Mahmoud Dahoud's late red card.
- Dortmund are unbeaten in six home games (W4 D2), since a 5-1 defeat against Stuttgart on 12 December.
- Dortmund have already suffered nine defeats in their 24 Bundesliga matches this season, two more than in the whole of 2019/20.
- Haaland, who has 32 goals in 34 Bundesliga appearances for Dortmund, became the first Bundesliga player to score 25 goals in his first 25 matches when he was on target twice in a 3-1 win in Leipzig on 9 January. He was replaced against Bayern after suffering an ankle injury.
- Sancho has scored six goals in his last eight Dortmund appearances, and has found the net in each of the last three.

- Raphaël Guerreiro (calf) and Sancho (thigh) both had to be substituted in Mönchengladbach and missed the defeat at Bayern.
- Manuel Akanji has missed the last four games because of a hamstring injury.
- Roman Bürki has not played since 22 January due to a shoulder injury, although he was on the bench at Bayern.
- Dan-Axel Zagadou was out between 16 January and 27 February with a hamstring problem. Thorgan Hazard (thigh) also returned in the win against Bielefeld on 27 February, his first appearance since a 2-0 German Cup victory at Eintracht Braunschweig on 22 December.
- Witsel is facing a long spell on the sidelines after rupturing his left Achilles tendon at Leipzig. He has been removed from Dortmund's UEFA Champions League squad, while Marcel Schmelzer, who underwent knee surgery in July, has also been left out.
- On 25 February BVB announced that Marwin Hitz has extended his contract until 2023.

- Having had their nine-game winning run in all competitions ended by the first-leg defeat against Dortmund, Sevilla have lost three of their subsequent four matches, going down 2-1 at Elche on Saturday.
- The other two defeats came against Barcelona – 0-2 at home in the Liga on 27 February and 3-0 away after extra time in the Copa del Rey semi-final second leg on 3 March, the latter result overturning a 2-0 first-leg advantage.
- Julen Lopetegui's side have 48 points after 25 matches of the 2020/21 Liga season, five more than at the same stage last year.
- After scoring eight goals in as many appearances between 9 January and 6 February, Youssef En-Nesyri is without a goal in seven games in all competitions.
- Yassine Bounou picked up a finger injury in training and missed the cup defeat at Barcelona and Saturday's Liga loss at Elche.
- Aleix Vidal had to be substituted in the defeat at Barcelona with a hamstring problem and sat out the weekend defeat.
- Jules Koundé missed the Elche match with a knock.
- Marcos Acuña suffered a thigh muscle injury in the 2-0 win at Eibar on 30 January, returning in the Copa del Rey loss at Barcelona.
- Lucas Ocampos suffered a sprained ankle in the 3-0 home win against Getafe on 6 February, returning at Barcelona on 3 March. The Argentinian missed a penalty in the game - the first time he has ever failed to convert a spot kick, having scored the previous 11.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

Overall records

- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid's 2018 triumph made them the first team to win three successive European Cups twice. The Spanish side won the first five editions of the tournament, between 1956 and 1960; Ajax (1971–73) and Bayern München (1974–76) have also lifted the trophy three years in a row.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

Knockout stage

- Real Madrid have qualified for the UEFA Champions League knockout phase a record 25 times, including 24 in succession. They have also played a competition-high 99 knockout phase matches – ahead of Bayern München (96) and Barcelona (95).
- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 49 times, including six in 2018/19 – a competition record for a single season – and Paris Saint-Germain in last season's round of 16.
- Before 2018/19, only twice – Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos in the 1995/96 semi-finals and Internazionale's victory against Bayern in the 2010/11 round of 16 – had a side progressed after a home first-leg loss. However, Ajax again (against Real Madrid) and Manchester United (against Paris Saint-Germain) both achieved the feat in the 2018/19 round of 16 before Tottenham (against Ajax) did likewise in the semi-finals.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by Barcelona against Paris in the 2016/17 last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home; Roma equalled that margin in the 2017/18 quarter-finals, turning round a 4-1 first-leg loss at Barcelona with a 3-0 home success, while in the 2018/19 semi-finals Liverpool lost 3-0 in the first leg at Barcelona but went through after a 4-0 home victory.
- Thirty-four ties have been decided on away goals, including 13 where the triumphant team lost the first leg. Bayern and Monaco have benefited from the away goals rule five times – more than any other club – whereas Internazionale have been eliminated by that method a record four times.
- In all, 30 ties have required extra time. Fourteen have been settled by extra time alone: seven round of 16 encounters including Atlético de Madrid-Liverpool in 2019/20, five quarter-finals, the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool, and the 2013/14 final between Real Madrid and Atlético.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw, still the only quarter-final to go to penalties. Bayern, Chelsea and Atlético have all appeared in three shoot-outs, sharing the competition record, with Bayern, Atlético and Liverpool having won the most (two apiece).
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Atlético and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid's defeat of Manchester City in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Liverpool (versus Porto) and Bayern (versus Beşiktaş) both won 5-0 in the 2017/18 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead – Real Madrid's 6-1 victory at Schalke in 2013/14 and Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting CP in 2008/09, both also in the round of 16.
- Bayern eventually beat Sporting by a record aggregate margin of 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie until it was equalled by Liverpool's 7-6 aggregate win against Roma in the 2017/18 semi-final.
- Bayern and Manchester City jointly hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match. Bayern beat both Basel (2011/12) and Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg, while City beat Schalke by the same scoreline at the same stage of the 2018/19 competition.
- A record five clubs from England participated in the 2017/18 knockout phase. Including 2019/20, England has also provided four clubs on eight other occasions – as has Spain six times and Germany three. England is the only nation

to have provided four quarter-finalists in a season, 2018/19 being the third occasion after 2007/08 and 2008/09.

- There are four clubs from two nations in the round of 16 for only the fourth time in 2020/21 (Germany and Spain). England and Spain both had four apiece in 2008/09, there were four each from England and Germany in 2013/14 while in 2019/20 Spain and England each had four representatives.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to have lifted the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win it three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) and Zinedine Zidane (2016, 2017, 2018) have replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburg 1983), José Mourinho (Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Fourteen more players, also including Messi and Robert Lewandowski twice, have scored four times in a game, most recently Olivier Giroud for Chelsea at Sevilla in the 2020/21 group stage. That was the fourth quadruple in succession to be scored away from home after Bayern's Serge Gnabry and Lewandowski (group stage v Tottenham and Crvena zvezda respectively) and Josip Iličić (Atalanta v Valencia, round of 16 second leg) all achieved the feat in 2019/20.
- Cristiano Ronaldo has scored 67 goals in the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds, more than any other player. Messi is second on 47 goals, ahead of Lewandowski (24), Thomas Müller (23), and Karim Benzema, Raúl González and Andriy Shevchenko (all 18).
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Youssoufa Moukoko is the youngest player to have appeared, aged 16 years 18 days for Borussia Dortmund at Zenit on 8 December 2020. He replaced Celestine Babayaro, who was 16 years 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994; Babayaro was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
